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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS BY NEW FELLOWS

1. I am a new Fellow - When can I nominate someone for Fellowship?

Immediately... when you receive your certificate you are considered a member or Fellow of the International College of Dentists. From that point forward any Fellow in good standing may nominate new Candidates.

2. If I know of a wonderful candidate but he/she is not in my ICD District how do I ensure this individual is recognized for Fellowship?

We have 17 Regents, 17 Vice Regents and 65 Deputy Regents who would love to hear from you about a worthy Candidate. The ICD Districts are the same geographically as the ADA Districts. A Sponsor does not have to be from the Candidate's District – This is a change from previous years. The first step in the nomination process is to

contact the Candidate's state/ chapter Deputy Regent to be screened locally. Further instructions can be found on our website at www.usa-icd.org then click on the Fellowship tab at the top of the page.

3. Who do I contact if I want to become more active in the ICD Organization?

After two years at the helm, I am beginning to see a light at the end of the tunnel. When I took over as President we had many projects that needed to be completed to align the Foundation with our newly set goals. We have reviewed and revised our Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation, Grant Request Packet and we are creating a Procedure Manual as this is being written.

Two years ago, our corpus was about \$750,000; now we are approaching \$1.5 million. This increase is allowing us to help fund the Section's Humanitarian Outreach Projects, International Student Exchange Program, as well as their Global Health Student Association. We continue to award grants to various entities (who meet our criteria) that help advance the education of dentistry and/or provide dental care to patients in underserved areas.

This past year we have developed two memorial funds that honor two of our great past leaders. These memorial funds offer a very special donation gift.

- The John B. Lathrop Memorial Level of \$1,000 – Gift: Framed collection of five to six dental stamps from the late Dr. Lathrop's personal collection. Dr. Lathrop's stamp collection was generously donated by his wife Ruth. (See sample collection.)

- The Richard G. Shaffer Memorial Level of \$500 – Gift: Specially designed coin with Dr. Shaffer's image on one side of the coin. The coin is packaged in a special pouch made from our retired robes - perhaps one you wore when you were honored with Fellowship. (See photos shown below.)



To date \$35,000 has been donated to these funds.

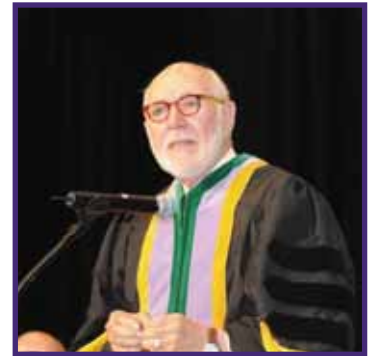

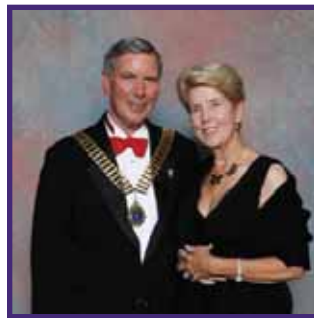
