ACD/ICD JOINT MEETING held MAY 14, 2009

On May 14, 2009 the annual ACD/ICD dinner meeting was hosted by the MD/ICD at the Sheraton Hotel in Towson. For those of you who attended, you were honored to be in the audience to listen to Dr. Benjamin Carson. He is the internationally renowned surgeon and director of pediatric neurosurgery at the Johns Hopkins Hospital. Dr. Carson holds more than 50 honorary doctorate degrees. He has been named by CNN and TIME magazine as one of the nation's 20 foremost physicians and was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2008 at the White House by President Bush. He is well known for his successful surgeries on Siamese twins joined at the head and the hemispherectomy of children with uncontrollable seizures.

Outside of pediatric neurosurgery, Dr. Carson has a special interest in trigeminal neuralgia. These are the only adult patients that he treats since he does believe that this is a true medical emergency that goes unrecognized by both the medical and dental profession. He is on a campaign to educate us, the dentist, to its symptoms and treatments. This was the main subject of his talk.

Dr. Carson's wife, Candy, was present, and the two of them have established the Carson Scholars Fund, a non-profit organization founded in 1994. This is very near and dear to their hearts. This fund recognizes young people of all backgrounds for exceptional academic and humanitarian accomplishments. The Carson Scholar Fund currently operates in 34 states and has awarded more than 3.9 million dollars to more than 3900 scholars. The Fund will choose students from the fourth grade through high school. Their awards are held and sent directly to their chosen college.

Dr. Carson did not request an honorarium, but our Maryland Chapter gave Dr. Carson a check for \$500.00 made out to the fund. Individually, many of us who attended gave personal checks. Go on line to www.carsonscholars.org, and you can see the magnificent story of this endeavor.
