Regent's Report

I am writing this, my first report as your newly elected Regent, as the snow and wind from the biggest December blizzard in Philadelphia meteorological history is winding down and the storm clouds are quickly moving out of the region. Although this much snow is unusual for us, the celebrations of December are constants, reminding us of miracles and courage, hope and expectation and promises made and kept. New Year's Day is rapidly approaching — that time of year when we take stock, contemplating the challenges of the past year and looking forward to each new opportunity in 2010.

We have had several changes within the Pennsylvania ICD leadership this past year. As Dr. Robert "Bobby" Kramer told you in his message a year ago, because of the surgery necessary to remove a tumor on his spinal cord, he suffered paresthesia of his left thumb and forefinger which effectively ended his career as a clinical dentist. That is the bad news. The very good news is that Bobby accepted a teaching position in Phoenix, Arizona at the Midwestern University School of Dental Medicine. This past summer, he and his family pulled up stakes and moved to the Grand Canyon State. He is thoroughly enjoying the exciting challenges and opportunities afforded him in his new position as part of a team teaching in the high tech dental simulation laboratories. His relocation created something of a dilemma for us since the College has an ironclad rule that in order to be a Regent, one must reside in the region which one represents. Bobby had to resign his

position, effective at the October convocation in Honolulu, Hawaii, and I was elected to fill his uncompleted term. As with all other aspects of his life, Bobby brought boundless energy and enthusiasm to the position. He will be sorely missed. I know that you join me in wishing him well in his new endeavors. Our loss is most certainly Arizona's gain.

The change in Regent also meant a change in the other officers. Dr. Peter Korch has taken on the responsibilities of the Vice Regent. He will continue to oversee the Leadership Program in Pennsylvania and serve on the national ICD-USA Section Subcommittee overseeing the Great Expectations Mentoring Professionalism Program. Dr. R. Donald Hoffman has graciously agreed to assume the position of Deputy Regent.

Three long time Counselors and members of the Screening Committee, Drs. Nicholas Saccone, John Staubach and Richard Galeone, have also resigned their positions after many years of dedicated and significant involvement with our Region. Both Nick and John have assured me that even though they will be less hands on, they will still be on the lookout for worthy candidates. Rich will continue as the Editor of our publication, The College Call, Chair of the Communications Committee and Editor of the USA Section publication, the KEY.

The departure of these valued members of the committee challenged your leadership to think about these positions in a new light. After much discussion, the job responsibilities and organization of both the Counselors and the Screening Committee have been updated and streamlined, to bring the way we do business in Pennsylvania more in line with what other regions are doing and in stricter compliance



The ICD, USA Section, Versus the ICD, College at Large

What is the difference between ICD USA Section and ICD College at Large?

The ICD USA Section, or Section One, is one of thirteen Sections which, together, constitute the ICD College at Large. The members of Section One are the Fellows in the United States. Within Section One, there are seventeen Districts which correspond to the seventeen American Dental Association Districts. Each District has a Regent and a Vice Regent, and each state within a District has a Deputy Regent. Some of the larger states, such as New York and California have more than one Deputy Regent. Section One also has an Executive Committee which consists of a president, past president, president elect, vice president, treasurer, registrar, deputy registrar, and editor.

The International Council is the governing body of the College at Large. The Council is comprised of the officers of the College and the Councilmen elected to the International Council by the various Sections. At the present the US selects ten Councilmen. The International Council has thirty elected councilmen, five officers, and the immediate past president for a total of 36 voting members.

The International Council meets once a year at a meeting of an autonomous Section. The ICD annual meeting is held in the United States every other year.

with the bylaws. Thus, a representative from each of the odd-numbered districts within Pennsylvania has been asked to serve a one year term as a Counselor. They have been tasked with the responsibility of looking for individuals who have demonstrated leadership in the profession and their communities and are deserving of nomination for Fellowship in the ICD-USA Section. The Counselors will not be looking exclusively within their districts, but we have asked them to concentrate their efforts within their respective areas. This year's Counselors are Drs. Rochelle Lindemeyer (1); William Yeomans (3); James Boyle (5); Craig Eisenhart (7) and Stephen Radack (9). Next year, we will be asking representatives from the even numbered districts to serve a term as a Counselor. In this manner, we hope to be able to target each area of the state on a rotating basis.

Members of the Screening Committee will continue to review nominations sent in by sponsors according to the Guidelines for Screening Committees. Like the Counselors and the Deputy Regent, they will serve one year terms and can be reappointed. And, in another break with Pennsylvania tradition, beginning with the 2010 convocation, the nomination process will be overseen by the Deputy Regent, allowing the Regent more opportunity to implement and oversee the various projects of the ICD-USA Section here in Pennsylvania.

Our Region is fortunate. We have had many outstanding leaders inducted into the College. Dr. Mary Anne Davis, our newest Fellow, was inducted at the convocation in Honolulu this past October. In addition, Dr. Robert Runzo was honored with Master Fellowship in recognition of his outstanding service to the U.S.A. Section of the College. Our congratulations and deepest appreciation to them both!

Please continue to seek out and nominate individuals whom you believe epitomize the ideals that the College stands for – leadership, integrity and service – to the profession and the community. If you are uncertain about the process, please do not hesitate to contact anyone of the officers or the Counselors. ICD Fellow Helps Haiti Victims

On January 12, 2010 a major earthquake devastated Haiti. The 7.0 magnitude quake struck at 4:53 in the afternoon just 10 miles west of Port-au-Prince, a city of 2 million inhabitants. A great many of the buildings collapsed, instantly ending the lives of as many as 200,000 people. By comparison

the United States lost 58,000 during the entire Viet Nam War.

The United States Navy responded and quickly dispatched its hospital ship, the USNS *Comfort* to Haiti. On Wednesday, January 20 the ship dropped anchor in the waters off of Port-au-Prince providing much-needed state-of-the-art technology to treat trauma and serious infections. The *Comfort* is designed to treat only those most critically injured.

The Commander of the *Comfort* is Navy Captain James Ware who is a graduate of the dental school of the Medical College of Georgia. Dr. Ware is a Fellow of the ICD from Savannah, Georgia.
